What to expect at the workshop:

The morning session will focus on piobaireachd (10am—12pm) and the afternoon session (1pm—3:30pm) will focus on light music. The cost for the workshop is \$50.00 for both the morning and afternoon or \$30.00 for just the morning session or just the afternoon session. Lunch is not included. Come and learn from one of piping's legends! You won't be disappointed!

Piobaireachd

The following tunes only may be submitted for the 2017 Atlantic Canada Piobaireachd Challenge events on April 29th. If settings used are taken from sources other than the Kilberry (K) or Piobaireachd Society (PS) collections, competitors must be prepared to provide the judge with a copy of the tune in the setting to be played. The judge may take into consideration the merits of the setting played.

Professional (Gold Medal): submit four tunes. Grade 1 (Silver Medal): submit three tunes. Grade 2 (Nickel Medal): submit two tunes. Grade 3 (Bronze Medal): submit one complete tune. Grade 4 (Copper Medal): submit one complete tune. Grade 5 (Pewter Medal): submit the Ground and Var. 1 singling of one tune only.

A mach variations are not required for the following events: Nickel Medal, Bronze Medal, Copper Medal and Pewter Medal. For the purposes of this competition, tunes marked with an asterisk (*) require crunluaths a mach in the Gold and Silver Medal Competitions.

Senior: In Praise of Morag, The Prince's Salute, The Unjust Incarceration, colin Roy MacKenzie's Lament, Craigellachie, Ronald MacDonald of Morar's Lament, My Dearest on Earth give me Your Kiss, Rory MacLoude's Lament

Gold Medal: Nameless: 'Hiharin dro o dro', The Park Piobaireachd No 2, The King's Taxes, The MacDougalls' Gathering, Beloved Scotland, The Vaunting, Lady MacDonald's Lament, Lord Lovat's Lament

Silver Medal: Group One: Hail to My Country, Lord Berisdale's Salute, The Sword's Lament, Rev. Dr. Norman MacLeod's Lament **Group Two:** Cronan Phadruig Seumas, Lament for John Morrison of Assynt House, Lament for the Iolaire, Roderick MacDonald's Salute

Additional/Optional Tunes for 2017 Atlantic Canada Grades 2/3/4/5: Little Prince You are My Choice, Sir Ewan Cameron of Lochiels Salute, Lament for the Rowan Tree, Alasdair Dearg Macdonell of Glengarry, Marquis of Argyll's Salute, The Munroe's Salute, Tulloch Ard, Lady Doyle's Salute, Glengarry's Lament

In events where more than one tune is to be submitted, the judge will select the tune to be played and competitors will be notified prior to their playing time.

Competitors from Atlantic Canada must be current members of the ACPBA. Competitors from other jurisdictions must be members of their own regional associations. In all events, tuning time before the judge must be kept to a minimum.

Order of Play: Last to enter in each event plays first. Competitors are asked to present themselves to the judge within three minutes of the completion of the previous competitor's performance. The order of play will be posted.

Entry Fee: All entries must be accompanied by a cheque or money order in the amount of \$10.00 made payable to The College of Piping and Celtic Performing Arts of Canada. Deadline for entries: Friday, April 14th, 2017.

Light Music

These are the following requirements for the 2017 Atlantic Canada Piobaireachd Challenge Light music events as taken from the Atlantic Canada Pipe Band Association rules and regulations (section 3.3).

Grade 5: A minimum of four (4) parts of a march in quick time. This may be a two (2)-parted tune played twice or a four (4)-parted tune played once. Any time signature will be accepted. Repeat parts where required.

Grade 4: A minimum of four (4) parts of a march in quick time. This may be a twoparted tune played twice or a four (4)-parted tune played once. Any time signature will be accepted. Repeat parts where required.

Grade 3: 2/4 March: Submit two (2) marches in 2/4 time, minimum four (4) parts, one of which will be chosen by the adjudicator. The tune will be played once only, though each part must be repeated. Submit one (1) four (4) parted Strathspey and one (1) four (4) parted reels.

Grade 2: MSR: The March and Strathspey/Reel contests may be combined into an MSR contest, in which case two (2) 2/4 marches, one (1) four (4) parted Strathspey and one (1) four (4) parted reel. The adjudicator reserves the right to select the set (mix and match is a possibility).

Grade 1: The March and Strathspey/Reel contests may be combined into a MSR contest, in which case two (2) 2/4 marches, two (2) strathspeys and two (2) reels must be submitted. The adjudicator reserves the right to select the set (mix and match is a possibility).

Professional: MSR: The March and Strathspey/Reel contests may be combined into a MSR contest, in which case four (4) 2/4 marches, four (4) strathspeys and four (4) reels must be submitted. The adjudicator reserves the right to select the set (mix and match is a possibility).

Entry Fee: All entries must be accompanied by a cheque or money order in the amount of \$10.00 made payable to The College of Piping and Celtic Performing Arts of Canada. Deadline for entries: Friday, April 14th, 2017.
